## DJ's Guide for ***Put Another Bullet In The Jukebox***

1. **Put Another Bullet In The Jukebox** (3:32) A humorous outlaw tune penned by prolific Boston songwriter Peter Conolly. A favorite at our performances, it features the singing of bassist Topher Gayle.
2. **Compadres In The Old Sierra Madres** (4:50) Riders in the Sky fiddler Woody Paul wrote this great tune. We got our version from the SF Bay area's Waybacks. Another outlaw song, it features the hot fiddle of Rachel Rosenberg and the lead vocals of guitarist Craig Sutherland.
3. **Leftover Biscuits** (3:00) Banjoist Joe Buczek sings lead on this lively, funny song, which compares marital infidelity to remaindered food items. One eight-year old fan in England wrote that she spent a whole day dancing to this tune! Five-part a cappella harmonies finish the tune off right, like a wafer thin mint.
4. **Angel Eyes** (3:00) This tune is sung by talented fiddler, Rachel Rosenberg. Briarwood recorded it the same night Rachel taught it to us. Listen carefully for her final word at the end of the tune, after she's told her suitor to buzz off.
5. **Old Home Place** (3:10) This bluegrass standard remains a favorite of ours. Craig Sutherland (guitar) interprets the lyrics his own way and makes it his own.
6. **Old Memories (Mean Nothing To Me)** (4:10) Mandolinist Chris Finn sings this tune in her sweet and sad way.
7. **What's Done is Done** (4:21) Guitarist Craig Sutherland wrote this song after being inspired by a happy upbeat song he heard. However, it is not happy and upbeat. It is funny, however, in a cynical sort of way.
8. **Passion Train** (4:44) We heard this tune on the Salamander Crossing album and it's always been one of our big favorites. Guitarist Craig Sutherland sings. You have to have train songs on a bluegrass or folk album. We have three.
9. **Steel Rails** (2:50) Here's the album's second train song. Guitarist Craig Sutherland sings.
10. **Dr. Dean** (3:32) Guitarist Craig Sutherland wrote this in honor of his favorite nationally syndicated radio talk show host, Doctor Dean Edell. Dr. Dean was so pleased that we sent it to him that he's played it on his show -- not once, but twice! This version was recorded live at the 2003 Wild Iris Folk Festival.
11. **Blue Train** (3:08) This third train song features soaring harmony arrangements behind guitarist Craig Sutherland's lead singing. This track was recorded live at the 2003 Wild Iris Folk Festival.
